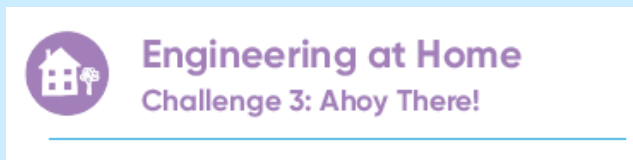

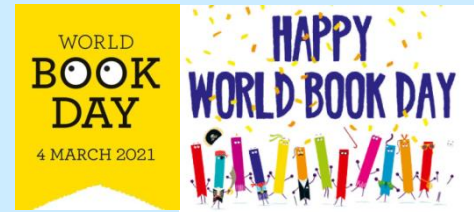
## STEPS Engineering Week

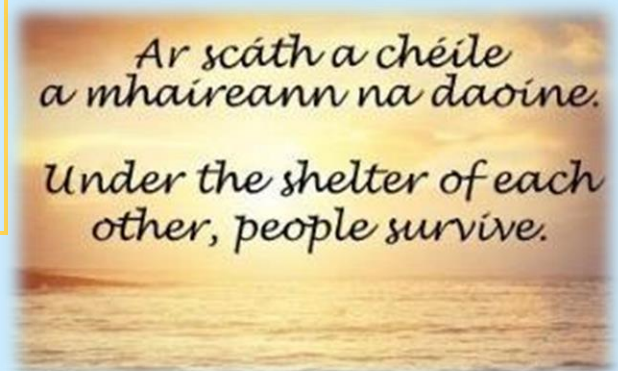
