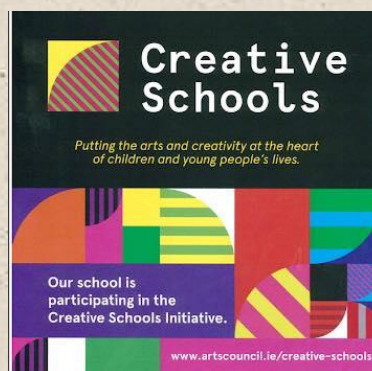
BT Young Scientist and Technology 2021!
