This week some of our TY students attended a "Women in Technical AMHARCLANN NA MAINISTREACH Theatre" workshop in the Hawk's Well this Monday. This was a collaboration between The Lir Academy and the Abbey Theatre, which aims to introduce young women to careers in lighting, sound and stage management.

The girls tried out a range of specialities that work together to



make a finished production. They learned that theatre is so much more than solely acting, although that is important too! Behind the scenes, we have the lighting technicians, who add even more dramatics, by setting a certain tone and mood via the colours and brightness of certain lights.

Then of course, the girls got to try out how to work some of the sound equipment. Sound also plays a key
